

THE GALACTIC HACKER PARTY
ICATA '89
AUGUST 2, 3 & 4, 1989.

The Galactic Hacker Party and ICATA'89 are organized jointly by Hack-Tic and Paradiso, Amsterdam's prime cultural centre and pop venue. There is a collaboration with the West German Chaos Computer Club (with a parallel node in Hamburg), with Terminal in France (node in Paris), and with the magazine 2600 in New York. In Wellington, Aotearoa/New Zealand, an antipodean Galactic Hacker Party will be held jointly with ours, keeping in constant electronic touch with us in Amsterdam.

ICATA'89, whose activities will be mainly in the morning hours, will carry a different theme each day:

Wednesday, August 2, 1989: "TO BYTE OR NOT TO BYTE"

There will be discussions about the relationship between "man" and machine, the imitation of the human brain, computer and creativity, democracy by computer (-networks), various aspects & consequences of virusses(-scare), and the many-sided links between ecology and computers.

Thursday, August 3, 1989: "THE HACKER IN THE LION'S DEN"

This day will be about the complex relationship between big money, governments and their (secret) services, and the right to information with regard to computers and their users. Is a computer a crow-bar? How do hackers and intelligence services interact? Free flow of information, the legislation on hacking both at the national (Dutch) and international level, censorship in networks and BBs, but also fascist computer games and virusses will be reviewed.

Friday, August 4, 1989: "THE FUTURE BEHIND THE COMPUTER"

Subtitled "the illusion of the Global Communication Village", this last day will explore the fantastic ideals and the none too pleasant realities of the "free flow of information" world-wide, especially from the point of view of the "Third World". Together with communication specialists from all over Africa gathered in Nairobi, we will examine whether "de-linking", rather than global connection, is not a better option for the so-called less developed countries. As a befitting finale, the various conclusions to which the participants will have arrived at will be subsumed in a declaration embodying the aims & wishes of the ICATA'89.

Meanwhile, during the middays and afternoons, the Galactic Hacker Party will have the building reel and shiver under waves of unlimited information-transfer, spectacular data-travels and unheard-of demos. The GAMENIGHT, on Thursday, will provide the ultimate in electronic entertainment. Arts and culture will not be forgotten either with performances by computer artists and literary events.

Op 2, 3 en 4 augustus 1989 vindt in Paradiso, Amsterdam, de eerste International Conference on Alternative Use of Technology (ICATA '89) plaats. Computer-, data-, netwerk en telecommunicatiespecialisten zullen elkaar hier ontmoeten en informatie uitwisselen. Dankzij moderne telecommunicatietechnieken kunnen ook geïnteresseerden op andere plaatsen op de wereld aan het gesprek deelnemen en de resultaten hiervan worden op een groot scherm zichtbaar gemaakt. Het is de bedoeling dat alle aanwezigen, of het nu captains of industry, computerwetenschappers, computerkrakers of PC gebruikers zijn, aan het forum over de ontwikkeling van de informatietechnologie deelnemen.

Het belangrijkste thema van de conferentie betreft de democratisering en demystificatie van moderne computertechnologie in het tijdperk van de schaalvergroting. Terwijl enerzijds de mogelijkheden van geavanceerde technologie vooral door de industrie en het publiek doorgaans zijn overschat, is anderzijds erg weinig aandacht gegeven aan de sociale, politieke en economische consequenties van deze technologie. Niet alleen worden de problemen in technische termen gesteld; ook de oplossingen worden gezocht in de almachtige techniek.

De telecommunicatie wordt beheerst door een relatief klein aantal ondernemingen en complexen. Zowel de individuele gebruiker als andere minder machtige partijen als bijvoorbeeld derde wereld landen zijn afhankelijk van datgene wat hen ter beschikking wordt gesteld. De manier waarop de computerindustrie gestructureerd is, kan leiden tot de situatie dat toegang tot- en gebruik van moderne informatietechnologie exclusief wordt voorbehouden aan een kleine elite van professionals, al dan niet met zakelijke belangen.

Het zal duidelijk zijn dat in dit licht het fenomeen computerkraken een ethisch aspect krijgt. Daarbij krijgt de discussie over deze problematiek een extra dimensie, omdat een aantal deelnemers aan de conferentie hun standpunt hierover meer dan eens in de praktijk hebben gebracht (NASA computerkraak, KGB affaire). Een demonstratie van de "methoden & technieken" door deze super-krakers maakt deel uit van het programma. Verder is er ruime aandacht, in theorie en praktijk, voor computertechniek, kunstmatige intelligentie, computeramusement, netwerkdemonstraties, fascistiese software, illegale software, virussen, datareizen en interactieve installaties.

PARTICIPATING ASSOCIATIONS, CLUBS, INSTITUTIONS

- ALTERNATIK/CIIII/TERMINAL Paris-based network (by Minitel), association and journal concerned with the social consequences of information technology. They foster a critical yet well-informed attitude towards computer and hi-tech in general.
- CHAOS COMPUTER CLUB is the now world famous German club of computer hackers that became a legend thanks to a few well-publicized hacks (Btx, the NASA-hack, and the pseudo-pilfering of the Hamburg Saving Bank, various VAX/VMS systems world-wide). Their motto is "use public data freely, protect private data firmly". Due to the prevailing German socio-political climate, the CCC is increasingly being viewed as a radical political movement, with consequent harassment from the authorities.
- DER DATENSCHLEUDER "The data-catapult" is the official organ of the CCC.
- HACK-TIC is the Dutch hacker magazine, first published in January 1989. It spreads technical knowledge to computer hackers and phone-phreaks. HACK-TIC is co-organizer of the GHP/ICATA'89.
- 2600 MAGAZINE The New York-based leading American publication for "phone Phreaks". They have a track record in exposing devious practices and policies of the major telecommunication companies.
- ARTburo HÆVFTIES Amsterdam-based group specializing in counter-cultural demontage & multi-media entertainment: image/sound/light/odors.
- BILWET(ADILKNO) is the Amsterdam-based "Foundation for the Advancement of Illegal knowledge". Their rather flamboyant brand of underground activities include lecture tours, radio/TV programmes seminars and various publications.
- RAVIJN PUBLISHERS Recently started Amsterdam publishing house specialized in critical literature. Their releases include a photo-book on Palestinians, a book on Shell and Apartheid, and P. Klerks' book on terrorism-control in the Netherlands. They are bringing out P.M.'s "BoIo'boIo" at the time of the conference and will shortly publish the Dutch translation of Daniel de Roulet's hacker-thriller "Ne comptez pas sur nous".

Theo WAMS

(Amsterdam/NL) is member the Dutch "Environment Defense" group and an expert is the field of waste management in the computer industry.

Steffen WERNERY

(Hamburg/FRG) is a computer specialist and leading member of the Chaos Computer Club. A major proponent of information openness, he has become of own experience, a specialist on official secrecy and repression as well. The ire of Philips-France, when he had entered their ill-protected system, put him behind French bars for 2½ month in 1988.

Dr. Gerard DE ZEEUW

(Amsterdam/NL) is professor in Andragology (the science of social change) at the University of Amsterdam. He specialises in computer application & development for the social sciences and in user-oriented languages & cybernetics.

Peter KLERKS (Amsterdam/NL) is a political scientist who has specialized in law and order policies, intelligence services and privacy protection in the Netherlands. He is the author of "Terreurbestrijding in Nederland" (Ravijn Publishers, 1989).

Allan LUNDALL (Bay Area/USA) is the top American expert in the field of computer viruses. His just published book VIRUS! will be presented at the conference (to be confirmed).

Marieke NELISSEN (Amsterdam/NL) teaches and develops computer systems for the Amsterdam Municipal Corporation, and is active in spreading computer literacy among women.

Werner PIEPER (Lörbach/FRG) is a publisher specializing in underground books and media experiments. He is the editor of the Chaos Computer Club's "Hackerbibel I + II" (1985, 1988).

Rolf SNIJDERS (Utrecht/NL) is a medical biologist who specializes in brain & behaviour. He is also a communication trainer for neurolinguistic programming and an expert in the field of knowledge elicitation for expert systems.

Suzan UGURSOY (Köln(Cologne)/FRG) heads a community association and edits "Chip Generation", a magazine for the Turkish-German youth. She is a specialist on vicious/racist computer games.

Velibor WELLER (Amsterdam/NL) is a computer composer and musician.

- Dr. Kwame BOAFO (Nairobi/Kenya) is a communication expert working with the African Council of Communication Education. He is a specialist in the field of telecommunication planning.
- Daniel DE ROULET (Genève/CH) is the author of the hacker-thriller "Ne comptez pas sur nous" (Don't count on us). He also developed, and now heads, a major medical computer system.
- John DRAPER (San Francisco/USA) is probably the best known telecommunication "expert" in hackers circles. His unauthorized "know-how" landed several times in jail. He is now working with Autodesk Inc. on computer aided design and pursues his own advanced research.
- Lee FELSENSTEIN (Berkeley/USA) has a long history of grassroot technological activism behind him and is co-founder of the famous "Community Memory" project in Berkeley. He is now in contact with the San Francisco/Moscow Teleport, a USA-USSR network system, in order to set up a shared software development computer system in these two countries. He is also presently engineering a totally new computer concept, the "Cyberpunk".
- Bernd FIX (Heidelberg/FRG) is an astro-physician and leading member of the Chaos Computer Club. He is the author of a crypto-programme and a specialist in computer-virusses.
- Dr. Cees HAMELINK (Amsterdam/NL & Nairobi/Kenya) is professor in communication science at the University of Amsterdam and the ISS in The Hague. His research focuses on power and influence in the media, hardware/software balances in communication politics, and the activities of information multinationals, especially with regard to the "Third World".
- Wau HOLLAND (Hamburg/FRG) is a reputed system developer and analyst and a keen advocate of computer-"Glasnost" in society and government. He is a leading member of the Chaos Computer Club.
